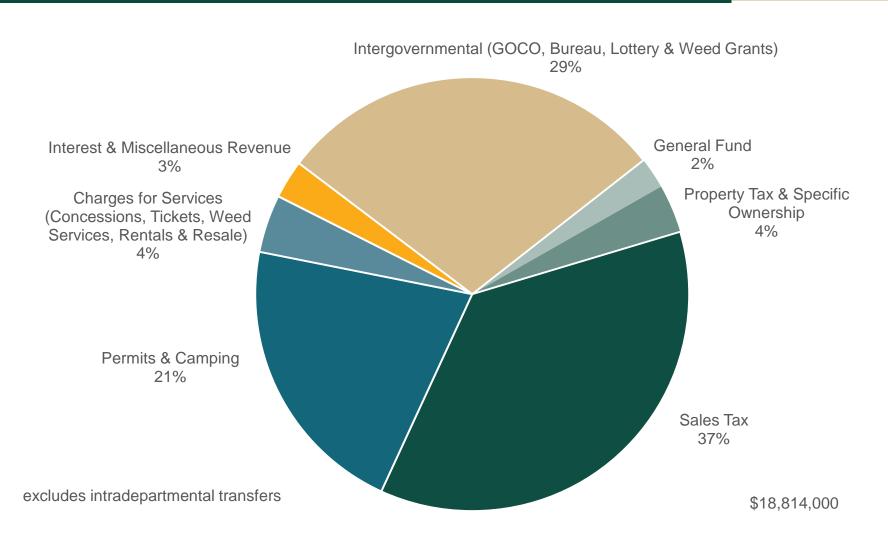

### 2018 DEPARTMENT REVENUE



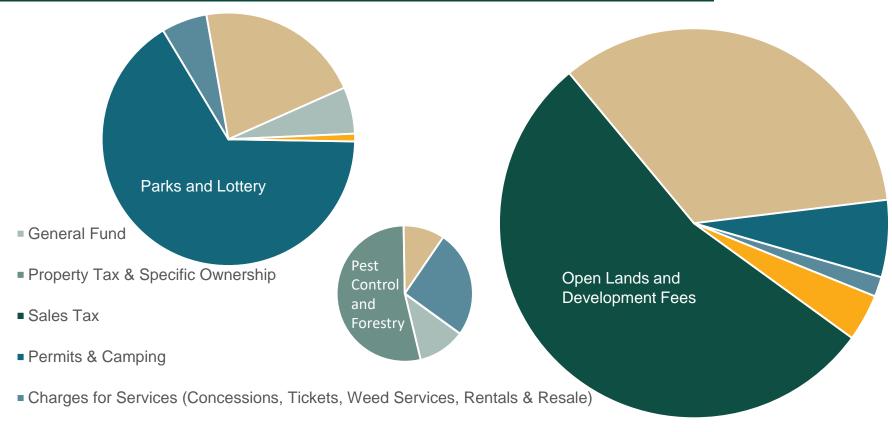

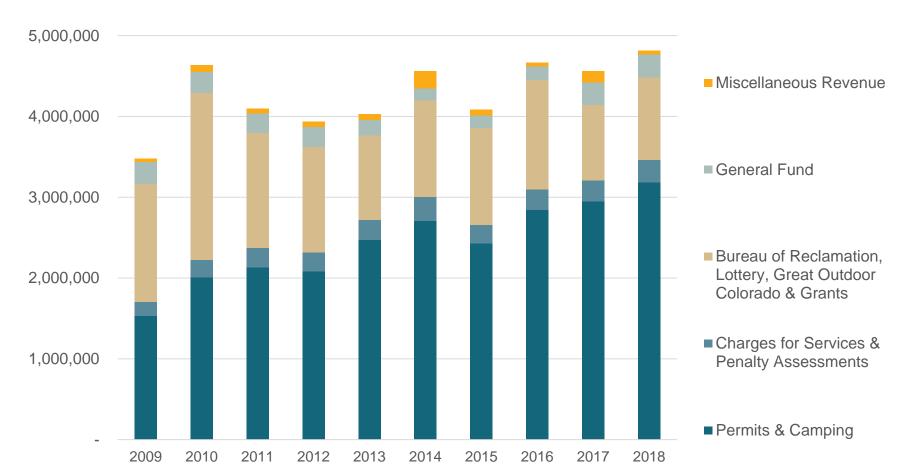
### 2018 REVENUE BY SECTION

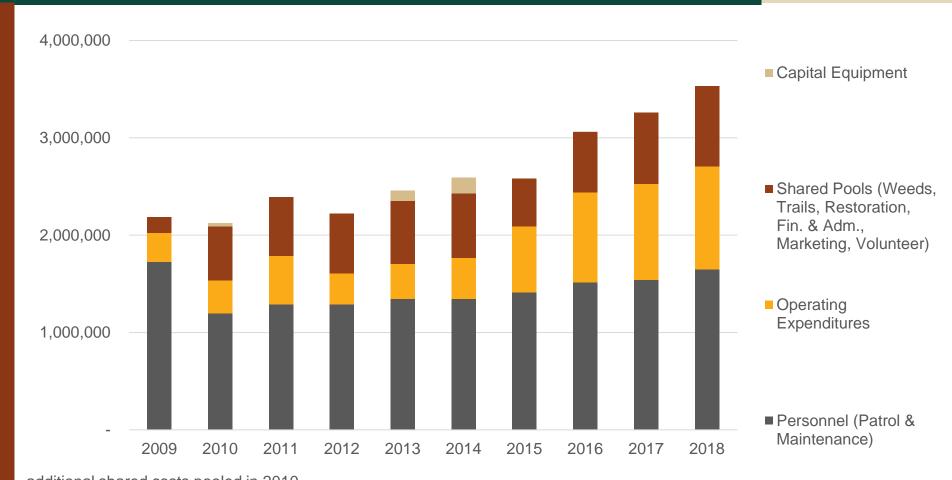

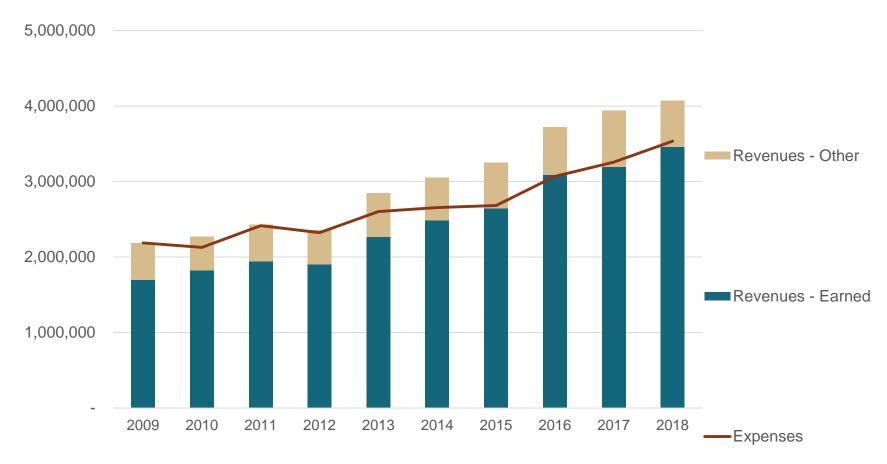
## RESERVOIR OPERATIONS EXPENSES

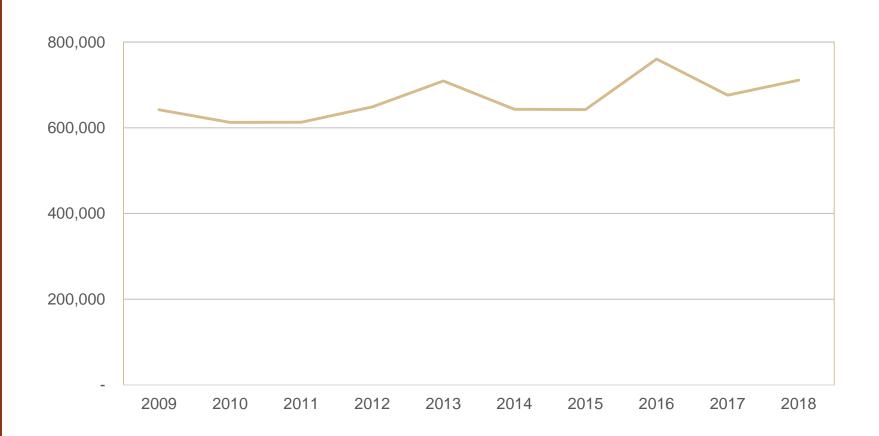
## RESERVOIR OPERATIONS REVENUE AND EXPENSES



park permit fee structure was totally revamped for 2013 camping fees recorded at gross beginning in 2016

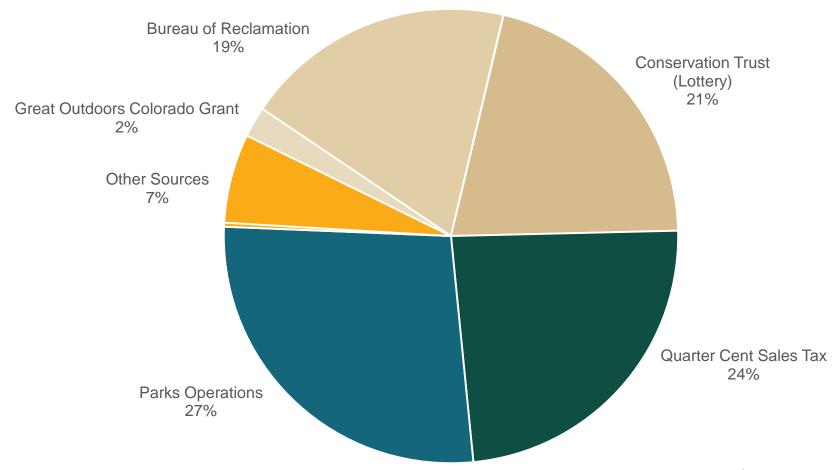


# CONSERVATION TRUST (LOTTERY) REVENUES

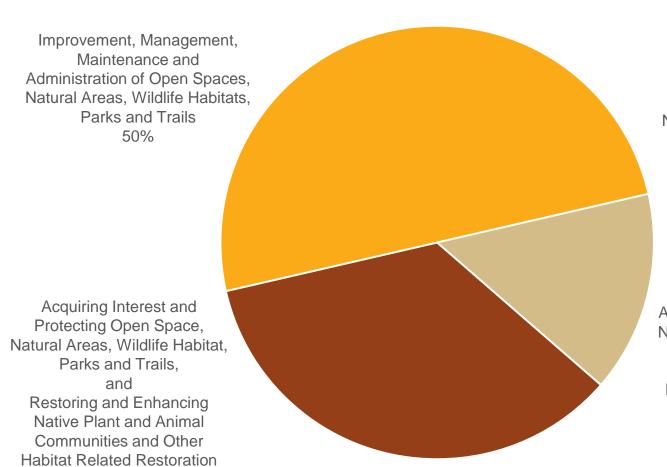

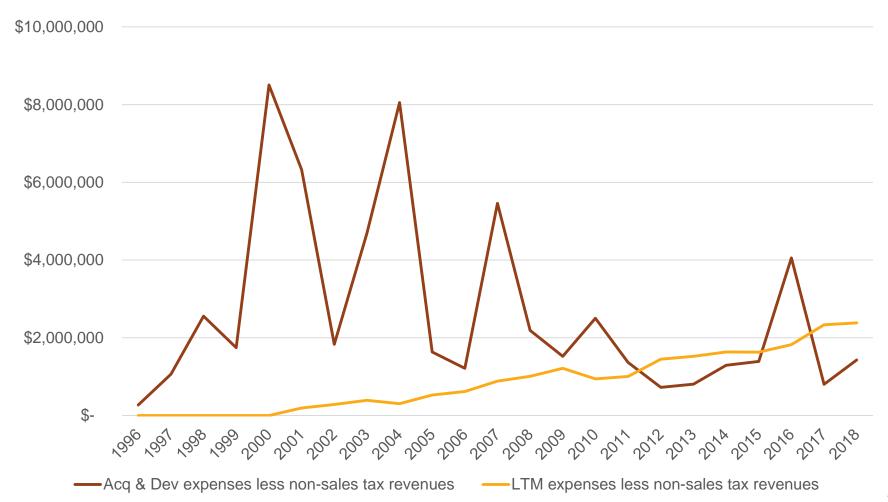

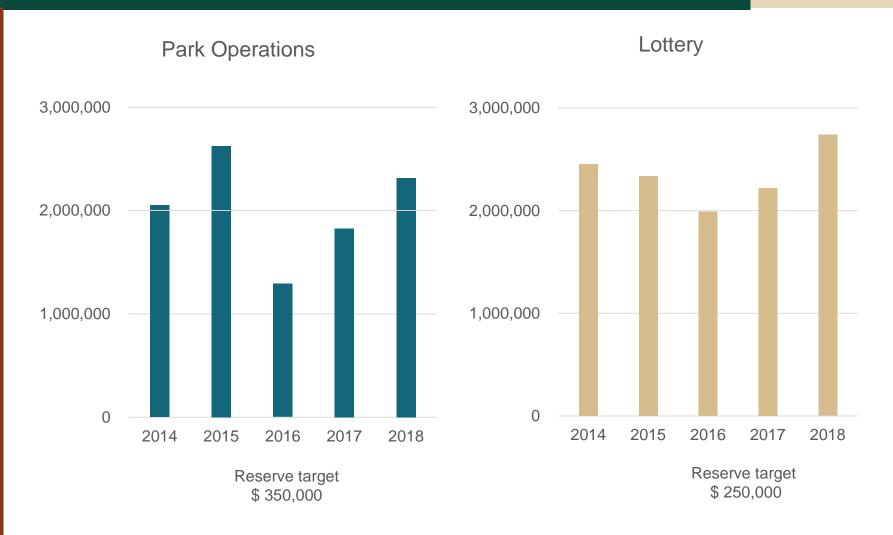

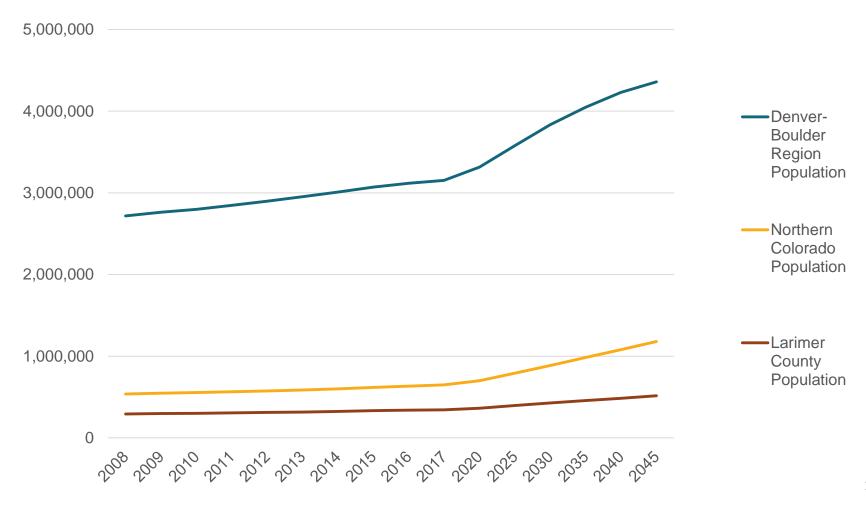
