2017-18 LARIMER COUNTY VISITOR USE STUDY RESULTS







Visitation has steadily increased at Larimer County open space and reservoir park properties over the past several years.

As the population of the State and the County continue to increase, the Natural Resources Department prioritized the need to better understand our users.

As a result, the Department launched a visitor study at several locations.











### **Purpose**

To determine the annual visitation at Horsetooth Mountain Open Space, Red Mountain Open Space, and Horsetooth Reservoir;

To ascertain visitor's overall experience, satisfaction of services, and preferences at the two open space properties

### **Team**







## Horsetooth Mountain Open Space Percent of Time Parking Areas Reached Capacity

# Capacity Weekday vs. Weekend









Horsetooth Mountain Open Space Percent of Time Parking Areas Reached Capacity

## % Capacity Time of Day











# Horsetooth Reservoir Inlet Bay, Satanka Bay, and South Bay Parking Lot Capacity

Surveys administered on-site at Main and Soderberg trailheads from June 2017 to May 2018








■ Red Mountain (%)


















# Primary Activities by visitors at HTMOS Trailheads








### HTMOS Specific Trail Uses Reported




### **Crowding/Conflict Summary**

- In general, visitors do not feel crowded (higher percentages of crowding occurred at the main trailhead)
- Visitors reported that they experience little to no conflict with other users (90% of visitors <u>never observed</u> hikers, mountain bikers, or equestrian riders behaving unsafely or discourteously.)
- 94% of visitors at RMOS and 98% at HTMOS reported there are no Larimer County properties that they avoid.
